GOAL

agroBRIDGES aims to build bridges between producers and consumers, empowering farmers with practical knowledge and support to rebalance their market position through new business models based on Short Food Supply Chains (SFSC). It will establish regional multi-actor structures for demand-driven innovation, and deliver a combination of practical tools, all packed in the agroBRIDGES toolbox

CONTEXT AND RATIONALE

Short Food Supply Chains (SFSCs) hold promising potential for sustainable development in agriculture

 - Rebalancing the market position of farmers and increasing their income
 - Meeting the societal demand of providing safe and quality local food
 - And all while also reducing the environmental impact of agriculture

Offer a combination of communication materials, training programmes, event guides, and digital tools packed in the agroBRIDGES Toolbox






Nearly 150 farmers and stakeholders trained on topics related to SFSCs

Enhanced farmers income by increasing their profit







Current status and next steps in 2021

- Designed and set up multi-actor framework with > 170 stakeholders engaged (ongoing)
- 35+ interviews to id needs and barriers for producers and consumers with survey on the works
- Scoping of best practices and success cases to inspire others with 36 practice abstracts
- 35+ interviews in Beacon Regions to identify and analyse sustainable business models
- Desk studies on policy incentives, labelling schemes and public procurement driving SFSCs
- Planning of 1 European and 12 regional workshops to discuss findings and inform development
